Hey neighbors - the boys and girls of Cub Scout Packs 77 and 36 and Scouts BSA Troops 1028/1029 and 37/3711 will be starting our annual Scouting for Food drive this Saturday 11/4 by distributing door hangers (see below), and will be returning to pick up donations next Saturday 11/11. All donations are picked up from your porch or by your mailbox (or I'm happy to make special arrangements - I live on Canvas Back) and delivered to the local Blue Ridge Area Food Bank on Harris Street. Typically the Charlottesville area Scouts deliver about 8,000 pounds of food and our Pack/Troop team collects about 1/3 of that each year from area neighborhoods. This is the 2nd biggest food drive of the year for the Food Bank, only the USPS drive brings in more food at once!
